

“On the Road To Becoming Anti-Oppressive: Peers Teaching Peers”

SWAOC's Video Curriculum

This video curriculum is a project of the Social Work Anti-Oppression Coalition (SWAOC), a student and faculty group, at Ryerson University's School of Social Work. The curriculum includes learning moments from 1999-2006 on issues of oppression and emancipation, discussed within formal and informal settings. Voices of BSW students, alumni, as well as community and university educators, are presented.

The footage is organized into short clips, which are ideal for triggering discussion among students. It also includes words by selected authors, and the concept of “Systemic Chatter” from Liberation Practice International (LPI), to support the ideas raised within some of the recorded conversations.

The objective of the curriculum is to offer a resource that can further the discussions on diversity and equity, particularly in regards to the Human Services. The goal is to provide material to generate inquiry, not to impose our opinions. As such, the ideas presented are not necessarily endorsed by SWAOC. We encourage people to explore their own meanings. Similarly, the footage has been organized by themes we have identified as useful. However, we encourage you to look closer and pull out themes relevant to your own teaching goals. You may want only to use parts from each clip. The video material is yours to support you in your own anti-oppression teaching objectives.

However, we do advise that clips be used to ignite conversation, rather than to instruct learning. We strongly urge instructors to contextualize each clip to their own context and to link the recorded conversations to contemporary power relations. These clips only show a moment of the discussion had and does not reflect a full analysis of the topic presented. The intention is for the clips to be used only as a springboard to further critical analysis. We also advise instructors not to use the clips on Systemic Chatter unless fully prepared to de-bunk each oppressive statement. SWAOC members are available for consultation regarding the use of the video curriculum, as well as able to visit your setting to provide customized training (see e-mail addresses below).
